Leader:

O God, you know our desire to be happy together. You also know our tendency to be self-centered and unaware of each other's needs.

Help us grow in awareness of each other. Help us remember that we are merciful when we give our spouse what he/she truly needs.

Pause

Leader:

Let us pray together the prayer that Jesus taught us:

All: Our Father, . . . Amen. +

Key Messages of Session Five

"Home is where the heart is," and marriage is a couple's home. Home is where we find understanding and compassion. Jesus preached, "Blessed are the merciful" (Matthew 5:7).

Compassion is the quality that leads spouses to put into practice Jesus' call to mercifulness. Being merciful starts with becoming aware of each other's needs and helping each other meet those needs. Through compassion we make our marriage our home.

Opening Prayer - Session Five

The BEATITUDES: A Couple's Path to Greater Joy
Your Marriage
is Your Home

Begin the prayer with the following or similar words.

Leader:

The theme for this session is that our marriage is our home.

Let us quiet our minds and open our hearts and take a moment to remind ourselves that we are in God's presence.

Pause

+ In the name of the Father . . .

All: We thank you, O God, for all the gifts you have given us this day.

We thank you especially for our spouse and for the gift that we are to each other.

As we prepare to enjoy this time together we ask you to help us be aware of your presence in our lives, and help us to listen to your voice.

Leader: Reflection

On our wedding day we dreamed of a making our life together our home, the place where we wanted to be more than anywhere else.

That dream gave us joy.

Jesus is telling us that to find that joy we need to learn to be merciful toward one another. He said: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy."

Mercy is compassion.
When we show compassion
towards our spouse, our marriage
becomes a comfortable home,
the place where we and our children
taste the goodness of God's mercy.

Then the warmth of our love radiates and everyone around us is touched by God's mercy and compassion. "Blessed are the merciful."

Leader:

Let us pray together the prayer of St. Francis.

All:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,
Where there is hatred,
let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
Where there is sadness, joy;

O Divine Master,
grant that I may not so much seek
to be consoled as to console;
To be understood as to understand;
to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive;
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
And it is in dying
that we are born to eternal life.
